Port of Aberdeen will continually improve its environmental performance and will strive to be exemplar in sustainability for the benefit of our customers, our community, and future generations.

We are committed to sustainable development (meeting the needs of the present without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their own needs) as a guiding principle within all facets of our work and activities.

We will:

- Deliver Net Zero by 2040 by actively reducing emissions across scopes 1, 2 and 3, in co-operation with our clients and partners.
- Improve the energy efficiency of our buildings and our activities.
- Facilitate decarbonisation innovation in the energy transition.
- Regularly review climate change impacts on our harbour and our operations and the effectiveness of any adaptation measures to climate change.
- Reduce waste, increase recycling, eliminate single use plastics wherever possible and promote the circular economy.
- Benchmark and monitor environmental data on air quality, water quality and protect biodiversity in the harbour.
- Promote sustainability risk thinking, strategy and procedures in our decision making.
- Provide the necessary information, training, supervision, and resource to ensure our compliance with the environmental management system ISO14001:2015 and seek continuous improvement with the system.
- Comply with environmental legislation and other compliance obligations that relate to the Port of Aberdeen.
- Protect the environment from negative impacts including pollution and contamination.
- Actively promote best practice in environment and sustainability amongst the Port of Aberdeen staff, port users, and wider shipping industry.
